Provincial Requirements for Graduation until 2026

Graduation requires at least 24 credits in 10, 20, 30 level courses, with at least 5 credits at the 30 level. The following 15 are compulsory credits: English (5), Math (2), Social Science (3), Science (2), Arts Education and/or Practical & Applied Arts (2) and Health/Physical Education (1). Grade 12 students should meet with the guidance counselor to ensure graduation requirements are met.

2026 Provincial Requirements for Graduation

Graduation requires at least 24 credits in 10, 20, 30 level courses, with at least 7 credits at the 20/30 level. The following 13 are compulsory credits: English (3), Math (2), Social Science (2), Science (2), Arts Education and/or Practical & Applied Arts (2), Health/Physical Education (1) and Financial Literacy 10(1). Grade 12 students should meet with the guidance counselor to ensure graduation requirements are met.

Alternative Credit Options:

SK Ministry offers students credits in recognition of non-traditional learning opportunities. These credits may be earned through individualized programs through special projects, apprenticeship or volunteer capacities. Students can also engage in dual credit learning through University studies, lifeguarding or military qualifications. As well, students can earn credit for successful completion of Royal Conservatory exams. Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Program:

Students interested in pursuing a trade can earn 300 hours of trade time credit through the Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Program. Much of the program can be completed through programming at RCS. Students in their Grade 12 year will work with Mrs. Reddekopp and Mrs. Munson to create a portfolio to complete the program. Students can enroll in the SYA program at any time during their high school career. The earlier they start the program, the less intense the workload will be each year.

GRADE 9

Note: All grade 9 courses are non-credit. Grade 9 provides students with an introduction to the high school timetable and courses. Credits begin in grade 10.
